The tenth-anniversary edition of Austria's leading international art fair, viennacontemporary, will take place under the artistic direction of Francesca Gavin from September 12 to 15, 2024 in Halle D of Messe Wien.

The fair is an annual highlight in the international art calendar, kicking off the new art and cultural events season. viennacontemporary is known as a place for discovering new and emerging artists; and serves as a gateway to the rich art worlds of Central and Eastern Europe, reaffirming Vienna's position as a cultural bridge between these regions.

This year's edition promises to be a landmark event, not only marking a decade of VCT but also celebrating its status as the leading art fair in Austria's vibrant contemporary art scene. With an exhibitor list comprising 98 galleries and 6 institutional stands from a total of 24 countries, the upcoming edition of viennacontemporary is the largest in years.

Program highlights include the curated sections ZONE1 – 10 solo presentations of young artists with a connection to Austria – which has earned a reputation as a significant platform for emerging artists and new talent. The fair also emphasizes a focus on women, showcasing the often overlooked contributions of female artists of the late 20th century alongside well-known male contemporaries in the new section CONTEXT; Last but not least, the VCT STATEMENT special exhibition *The Color of Energy* artistically addresses the key theme of sustainability and energy production and regionally links the Austrian major art cities, Vienna and Salzburg.

An informative talks program highlighting the potential of the regional art scene, numerous guided tours for young and old, performances, and events invite visitors to engage more deeply with the fair program, and numerous art prizes in cooperation with our valued partners play an important role in promoting galleries and their artists.

Numerous renowned art festivals, such as the gallery festival Curated by and PARALLEL Vienna, which take place simultaneously with viennacontemporary, transform Vienna into a vibrant hotspot for art and culture in September. Exciting exhibitions and events in close cooperation with these major festivals and the city's leading cultural institutions attract art lovers and cultural professionals from all over the world. With the fair's international networking initiative *Join The Conversation*, seven important curators from all over Europe will also travel to to discover the local art scene.

We look forward to welcoming you to this exceptional celebration of contemporary art in Vienna!

viennacontemporary 2024 will once again offer a courageous and political program of talks that will bring together international collectors and opinion leaders from the art world to critically discuss the potential of art fairs and highlight the great potential of the region. This year, special attention will be paid to the two *Nexus Thinking* talks, which will explore interdisciplinary solutions to the climate crisis as part of the special program VCT STATEMENT: ENERGY, which connects contemporary art to current sociopolitical discourses. ART PRIZES

Numerous viennacontemporary art prizes support the promotion and visibility of up-and-coming artists. Awards such as the viennacontemporary | Bildrecht SOLO Award, the Queer Art Prize, the VCC x viennacontemporary Collectors Prize, and the LUKOWA Acquisition Prize honor both creative excellence



and the work of galleries. These prizes underline viennacontemporary's commitment to supporting a diverse and forward-looking art scene that shines a spotlight on innovative artistic approaches and social issues.

viennacontemporary | Bildrecht SOLO Award

With the aim of supporting artists and galleries alike, the viennacontemporary | Bildrecht SOLO Award recognizes a presentation that exhibits outstanding artistic potential. At the same time, the commitment of the respective gallery is honored. With the help of an independent jury of experts, Bildrecht will present this year's award at the Preview on September 12, 2024. The award, which includes a total prize of 4,000 euros, will be shared equally between the artist and the exhibiting gallery, with each receiving 2,000 euros.

<u>VCC x viennacontemporary Collectors Prize</u> For an emerging artist, powered by efko and VORmagazin

The Vienna Collectors' Club, in cooperation with viennacontemporary and VORmagazin, will again present the "Collectors Prize" for emerging artists. A jury of curators, collectors, and key people from the art world will choose one emerging artist from ZONE1 to award the prize before the opening. The prize includes a monetary award of 1,000 euros for future projects for the winning artist, provided by efko, and an interview in the October issue of VORmagazin.

<u>Queer Art Preis 2024</u> by viennacontemporary and Queer Art Spaces Vienna Supported by Radatz, Almdudler, and GayParship

The Queer Art prize consists of two categories: the Community Prize is directed at queer artists / queer art, and the three winners will receive a cash prize and have their artworks showcased at this year's viennacontemporary. The Gallery Prize is directed at participating galleries to promote more queer art at the fair.

LUKOWA Acquisition Prize

LUKOWA Group is looking to acquire an artwork presented at viennacontemporary 2024, thematically relating to the distribution of power. The idea is to explore ways in which this word and its meaning are present and analyzed in various artistic practices today, with an understanding that the interpretations of this subject can vary greatly. The context the collection is looking for is not limited to political, economic, or social issues, it rather encourages a much broader scope of iterations that can offer unique views on what "power" could mean. The collection allocates up to 5.000 CHF for the acquisition.

About the collection and initiative

LUKOWA Group supports emerging to mid-career artists to encourage outstanding ideas. The initiative considers contemporary culture and fosters a forward-looking worldview, engaging the art community and the public. They prioritize recognizing artistic quality before other factors, such as age, origin, or nationality, providing space for equal opportunities.
