

# viennacontemporary Appoints Abaseh Mirvali as New Artistic Director

Vienna, April 24, 2025 – viennacontemporary is pleased to announce two senior appointments to its leadership team. The internationally respected cultural leader, Curator, and Museum Director Abaseh Mirvali will join the 2025 edition as Artistic Advisor, while simultaneously beginning her tenure as Artistic Director for the 2026 edition. In addition to Mirvali, the fair welcomes Christina Wagner as Chief Operating Officer. With this strengthened Leadership Team, viennacontemporary signals its commitment to expanding the fair's global impact while staying deeply connected to its Central and Eastern European roots.





With her extensive institutional experience and global network, Mirvali brings a long-term vision rooted in collaboration, innovation, curatorial excellence, and international engagement. With the appointment of Abaseh Mirvali as Artistic Advisor for its 2025 edition (September 11–14), viennacontemporary sets the stage for a new phase in its development. Mirvali will concurrently begin preparations for her role as Artistic Director of the 2026 edition, marking a long-term commitment to shaping the fair's evolving artistic and programmatic vision.

# Abaseh Mirvali to Lead Artistic Direction

Mirvali is an internationally respected Executive, Curator, and Cultural Strategist whose two-decade career spans leading institutions and curatorial platforms across Europe, the United States, the Near East, and Latin America. Her work is defined by a collaborative ethos, civic-mindedness, and an ability to engage diverse communities through contemporary art. She previously served as Executive Director, Chief Curator, and CEO at the Museum of Contemporary Art Santa Barbara, Executive Director of the Biennial of the Americas, and Executive Director of Fundación/Colección Jumex Arte Contemporáneo in Mexico City. She has also held key curatorial and advisory roles at major art fairs, including ArteBA in Buenos Aires, Artissima in Torino, miart in Milan, and Art Basel.

A longtime advocate of Vienna's cultural landscape, Mirvali first connected with the city through curated by, one of its most acclaimed curatorial initiatives, and has since maintained a dynamic relationship with the local scene. At viennacontemporary, she curated the Solo Expanded section with a vision of bridging cultures—bringing emerging voices into dialogue with established practices. She continues to champion Viennese artists and institutions abroad, integrating them into wider international conversations whenever possible.

**Francesca Gavin,** who served as Artistic Director for the 2024 edition, will step down to focus on other editorial and curatorial projects. The fair's board, management, and team express their gratitude to Francesca Gavin for her contributions and professionalism, which supported a successful edition and brought a renewed international focus to viennacontemporary's program.

He recently co-curated the 2024 Matter of Art Biennale in Prague and was a fellow at the Vera List Center for Art and Politics in New York from 2022 to 2024.
